

Electronic Poster Tips

- 1. Before you start preparing your e-poster, ask yourself the following:
 - a. What is the main goal of the e-poster?
 - b. What do you want your audience to take away?
 - c. What would you like someone who is passing by your e-poster to do?
 - i. Do you want them to stop? If so, give a catchy title to draw them in.
 - ii. Do you want them to reach out to you and engage in a discussion? If so, make your e-poster about a topic that is of interest but may not be widely used, a 'Hot Topic' that is getting lots of attention or an existing concept that is used in a novel way.
- 2. An e-poster is like an outline, not a novel. Keep the information on the e-poster simple and easy to follow. Remember that you will not always be there to explain it.
- 3. Graphs, column charts, box plots, drawings, and other artwork are effective e-poster enhancements.
